Over their last few matches, Hampton's resilience and determination have been demonstrated in spectacular fashion.

On a sweltering afternoon of Sunday 17<sup>th</sup> August, Hampton faced Ashford away, looking to improve their position in the table. Ashford fielded a number of their stronger players, but Hampton managed to win comfortably by 3 rinks to 1, and with an aggregate shots score of 74-54 boosted their shots difference total by 20.

In the home fixture against leaders Fordbridge Park, the match position after the early ends was looking very gloomy. However, a spirited comeback by our players ultimately delivered a 3-1 rinks win to Hampton.

The following two fixtures, held on successive weekend days, delivered stunning results – at home against Stanwell, a clean sweep in rinks won and shots difference; and a near repeat away to Sunbury, where 3 rinks were won and 1 drawn. Over a single weekend Hampton banked a massive 19 points, probably taking us to first or second position in the league table! Just four matches left to play...
