#### High Noon!

The final fixture of the 2025 South Middlesex Mixed Triples League was held at Carlisle Park on Tuesday 9<sup>th</sup> September. The two teams at the head of the table, Hampton and Staines, met in an encounter that would decide who finished top.

At the start of play Hampton held a 9 points advantage over Staines, meaning that only a 10-0 clean sweep of rinks by Staines could prevent HBC from retaining their title. In other words, Hampton needed to secure just one draw or win. Most Hampton players were confident there was only a small chance of Staines achieving their goal, but the visitors had arrived with a very strong team and a determination to defy the odds.



In the early stages of the contest the scores over the four rinks were slightly in favour of Staines, but as the ends ticked over, they were clearly launching a strong challenge, to the extent that the prospect of 10-0 win for them was becoming a distinct possibility. Several of Hampton's bowlers

were casting nervous glances at the scoreboards behind them, which did little to calm their nerves. On Rink 6, Kevin Keown's team had fallen behind badly in the early stages of that match, and been discounted by most spectators as likely to deliver any points for the home side. That rink was also ahead on ends completed, so would probably finish their game first.



But as Hampton's worries on the other rinks deepened, Kevin and his team raised their game superbly. With many home spectators almost too afraid to watch, they scraped home on the 18<sup>th</sup> end for a win and 2 precious points.

Victory in the league for Hampton was assured, despite Staines winning the other three rinks to post an 8-2 points triumph.

Congratulations to all the players who have represented Hampton Bowling Club during the league season and to all the spectators who have supported them!

# **Snail Mail Tale**

As he had no envelopes at home, Richard Duke recently asked the Club Secretary to post a letter that he had written to the Chief Executive of the London Borough of Richmond upon Thames about their hedge cutting policy around our green.
